

- Families of veterans who served before the recent wars won't be added to the <u>Veterans Affairs caregivers program</u> until summer 2020 at the earliest. The delay had been expected for months, as VA officials struggled to get new technology and processes in place to handle an influx of new applicants to the program. Currently, only families of troops injured after Sept. 11, 2001, are eligible for program stipends, which can total several thousand dollars a month. Under the VA Mission Act passed last year, veterans who sustained a serious military-related injury before May 7, 1975, were supposed to be able to enroll starting this fall. Now, they'll have to wait at least June 2020 for entry, if not longer. The timeline shift also pushes back eligibility for families of veterans who served from 1975 to 2001, from fall
